The 19th ICS, held in conjunction with the 38° CBE, marks a historic moment for the global scientific community. Under the theme "60 Years of UIS: History for the Future," this event, hosted in Belo Horizonte from July 20 to 27, 2025, will serve as a milestone for interdisciplinary discussions on caves, karst systems, and subterranean biodiversity.

The congress stands out for its broad thematic scope, with 461 submitted papers and over 1,000 registered participants. Topics will be covered in 10 symposia and 16 Technical-Scientific Committes, focusing on science and innovation. However, the event goes beyond academia, exploring the intersections between the environment and society. Discussions on environmental legislation, conservation management, sustainable tourism, and environmental education will also be highlighted.

Pre- and post-Congress activities are also in full swing. Fourteen field trips have been confirmed, involving

more than 200 participants. The Wednesday excursions, a highlight of the event in terms of scientific community interaction, are a great success, and all spots are almost fully booked.

We strongly recommend visiting the official event website, www.speleo2025.org, to access complete content and useful information for planning your participation. Regular updates will be posted to help you be informed about the progress of your preparations.

The 19th ICS not only celebrates the past of the

UIS (International Union of Speleology) but also charts a route for the future. The integration of science, technology, and society will be a key to addressing the challenges of 21st-Century Speleology.

2 IMPORTANT INFORMATION!

At the time this circular is published (May 2025), we are less than three months away from the opening of the 19th ICS. There are 461 papers submitted and more than 1,000 people registered.

For those who haven't yet registered, please note that Full Category is no longer available. However, the other categories are still open. Take advantage!

For additional detais about the Congress, its organization, the host city, climate, and other information to plan the trip to Brazil, we recommend read the Second Circular (available here). On pages 4 and 5 of the Second Circular, for example, there is information about traffic, parking, rules on alcohol and smoking, tips, currency, healthcare, collaboration for a green congress, visas, as well.

What we want is for you to have the most enjoyable experience possible during your time in Brazil, whether at the conference itself or on the numerous excursions planned for you. Below is some information that we consider important to repeat:

- Please see the 19th ICS website. The address is www.speleo2025.org and is in the footer on each page of this circular. The website has far more information and details than could be informed here.
- **Reservations** for all trips and activities is based on the order in which you register.
- **Reservations** for pre- and post-congress trips must be received by 15 May 2025. After this date, participation will depend on whether there are places available.
- All caves in Brazil are protected by Federal law. It is therefore expressly prohibited to remove from the cave any type of sample, whether animal, vegetable, or mineral, without prior official authorization. In addition, visitors are expected not to cause any damage to the cave, property, or people in their group.
- **Portuguese and English** are the official languages of this ICS and its field trips. Translation services will not be provided.
- **Visa.** If you are from a country that requires a visa for Brazilians, you will also need this permission to enter Brazil. It is therefore recommended that you make arrangements in advance, as in some countries this procedure may take longer than expected.
- **Airport transportation.** The congress will not provide transportation airport/event/airport. Therefore, each participant must arrange this transportation on their own. The main options for that are described on <u>page 7</u> of this Third Circular.
- **Accommodation.** When making your reservation at one of the 19^{th} ICS partners hotels (see <u>page 10</u> of this circular), remember to state that you are attending the

congress. As the congress venue is in the center of the city, no campground will be available.

The MAAC Travel will have an office inside the congress venue and are ready to help you in any trip or extra activity you are interested on during your stay in Belo Horizonte.

- **ID Badges.** ID badges must be worn visibly at all times during the ICS. You can be asked by ICS staff to present your badge.
- **ICS InfoPoint.** The ICS info Point will be located at the first floor, just near of of Registration Desk. Please come to there with your questions.
- Internet Connection. Free wireless network for mobile internet access will be available in all building of BeFly Minascentro, the Congress venue.
- Lost and Found. We encourage anyone, who finds an abandoned possession to please bring it to ICS InfoPoint. All unclaimed items will be kept until the end of Congress until 16:00 on Sunday July 27, 2025. After this period, such itens will be given to charities.
- **Medical Services.** A special room at the third floor of the Congress Venue will be used for FirstAid. Opening times will be announced on the ICS Program.
- **Pets.** No pets will be allowed in the internal areas of the BeFly Minascentro, the Congress Venue.
- **Parking.** BeFly Minascentro has outsourced parking with 80 places in the internal area. Payment is made directly on site. Severeal other options for parking are available in the vicinity. Large recreational vehicles will not be accepted in the internal parking of the venue.
- **Smoking and Trash.** Smoking is not allowed in any venue internal area. During the week of the Congress, a special smoking area will be available for smokers outside of the venue.
- Food at Congress Facilities. Two food outlets will be installed on the BeFly Minascentro premises. In addition to the snack bar at the main entrance, other options will be distributed in BandStand Square (second floor), as a complement to EspeleoBar. Opening hours and rules will be announced in due course.

HOW TO GET TO THE CONGRESS PREMISSES

Belo Horizonte is served mainly by the International Airport of Tancredo Neves, best known as the Confins Airport. It is situated some 40 km away and is linked to the center of the city by express highways.

When disembarking at Confins International Airport, passengers will have several options for getting to the city. In addition to taxis and app transportation, the bus company *Conexão Aeroporto* (Airport Connection) offers direct lines to the *Terminal Conexão Aeroporto* (Airport Connection Terminal), located 700 meters from the congress venue.

Another company, <u>Unir</u>, offers buses from the airport to the <u>BH Central Bus Station</u>, located 1.5 km from the venue.

Once in BH, public transport offers an extensive network of circulating buses and train (<u>MetrôBH</u>). The services of taxis and transport by app (UBER, 99, RepMov,


and Urban BH) are also available at any time of the day or night. Take into account, please, that no Dollar, Euro, or other foreign currency in cash is acceptable. To do so, have in hands your credit card or Brazilian money cash, the Real.

For those who reach Belo Horizonte by car or bus, the main access roads are the BR-040, for those arriving from Rio de Janeiro (RJ) or Brasília (DF), the BR-381, for those arriving from São Paulo (SP), and the BR-262, for visitors traveling from Vitória (ES).

Those who intend to rent a car will have no difficulty. However, other events that will be held in Belo Horizonte during the same period as the congress can contribute to increased demand for cars. We therefore recommend that you make your rental as early as possible.

BELO HORIZONTE, THE HOST CITY _

The capital of the state of Minas Gerais, Belo Horizonte, affectionately called BH (Beagá), is located in the southeastern region of Brazil, at an altitude of 852 m. With more than 2.5 million inhabitants, it is the 6th most populous city in the country and the first Brazilian city to be a member of the World Tourism Cities Federation (WTCF).

Belo Horizonte is strategically located in the heart of the Brazilian karst, close to one of the most prominent regions in the carbonate karst landscape and in the history of natural sciences in Brazil: the Lagoa Santa Karst. In addition, the city is one of the main venues for discussions on the legal framework related to the subject and is home to a large concentration of speleologists.

For recreation, BH has an ample network of parks and gardens, providing numerous attractions for visitation by congress participants and/or their accompanying family members through tourist agencies or privately. Some of them are in the list for Wednesday trip.

CLIMATE

Belo Horizonte is surrounded by mountains and has a hot, yet temperate, climate, with annual temperatures varying from 13°C to 29°C (55°F to 84°F), and rarely dropping below 10°C (50°F) or rising above 32°C (90°F).

During the period proposed for the congress (end of July), the following conditions are expected:

Average temperature: 18°C (64°F)

• Minimum temperature: 13°C (55°F)

• Maximum temperature: 25°C (77°F)

• Rainfall: 9 mm (the driest period of the year in BH)

• UV index: 2


• Hours of sun per day: 9

FOOD AND DRINK

Known as "Bar Capital of Brazil," BH is famous for its street food, traditional dishes, and high-end dining experiences. This makes it an excellent destination for food lovers.

To accompany its delicious cuisine, Belo Horizonte also offers a wide variety of craft beers, making it famous in this regard as well. The world-famous "Caipirinha," the Brazilian drink made with lime, cachaça, sugar, and plenty of ice is also found everywhere.

While alcoholic beverages is only allowed for adults, the typical Brazilian food is recommended for all ages. We hope everyone will appreciate it.



THE VENUE

Occupying an entire city center block, the Minascentro Convention Center, recently renamed BeFly Minascentro, has Neoclassical style architecture. Listed by the Historic Heritage of the Municipality of Belo Horizonte, it undergone recent modernization in its structure to become one of the largest experiential centers in Minas Gerais.

Located just 1.2 km from the main bus station, BeFly Minascentro is 40 km from Tancredo Neves (Confins) International Airport.

Spanning over 23,000 square meters across 3 floors, independent entrances and accessibility, it has the capacity to accommodate over 8,000 people simultaneously, featuring one of the largest theaters in MG (1,570 seats). With modular and multi-format occupancy and air conditioned in all internal areas, it also boasts:

- 6 auditoriums of varying sizes (from 100 to 428 seats)
- · 18 rooms for vaious uses
- 1 multipurpose room (1,368 m²)
- Areas for exhibition (2,235 m²)
- A car park (80 spaces inside, but there are many options in the vicinity)
- 2 open air areas for bars and recreation

The decision in favor of BeFly Minascentro was because it offers all the facilities required for a UIS Congress as well as a comprehensive package of audiovisual solutions, high-performance internet, digital studios, furnished rooms, streaming, services, catering, automation, and technology.







9 INTERNATIONAL CAVE ARTS **SALONS AND SPELEMEDIA**


Following the tradition of UIS congresses, the 19th ICS will held a series of exhibitions and competitions related to cave art, as follows:




CARTOGRAPHIC SALON invites all cartographers to submit their cave documentation works for this contest. This competition combines both technical expertise and artistic representation.






CAVE ART SALON (SPELEOART) is the Congress space dedicated to exhibiting works of art inspired by caving. Artworks can be in any medium, from sketches to digitally altered photographs, computer graphics, ceramics and sculpture, textiles and mixed media. During the event, young explorers will have a special place just for them. Bring your chindren to enjoy this playful and educational environment designed to spark their curiosity about the fascinating world of caves!


